





DETAILED SALEYARD REPORT – CATTLE

CTLX Carcoar

CTLX Carcoar report date 14 January 2020

Yarding 2630

It was a good quality yarding with good numbers of ideal feeder cattle along with good numbers of well finished cows. Plainer conditioned cows were also well supplied and there was a better selection of grown steers and heifers. Most of the regular buyers were back in attendance and operating.

The few young cattle to the trade were firm with prime yearlings selling to 280c/kg. Feeder steers and light weight feeder heifers were 15c to 25c dearer and more in places while the heavier feeder heifers were 2c/kg dearer. Feeder steers sold from 260c to 323c, while the feeder heifers sold from 240c to 284c/kg. Young restocker cattle were a little dearer with the young steers selling from 230c to 293c, while the young restocker heifers sold to 253c/kg.

Grown steers and heifers were dearer with the prime grown steers selling from 265c to 280c, while the grown heifers sold to 250c/kg. Prime conditioned cows were 18c dearer, while the secondary cows were up to 32c/kg dearer. The 2 score cows sold from 140c to 186c while the better 3 and 4 scores sold from 180c to 220c with the prime heavy weights averaging 214c/kg. Cows to southern restockers were considerably dearer selling from 130c to 186c while cows to the feeders were 13c to 18c dearer, selling from 190c to 208c/kg. Bulls were also dearer, selling to 250c/kg.

DETAILED SALEYARD REPORT - SHEEP AND LAMB

CTLX Carcoar report date 15 January 2020

Yarding 15900 Lambs 7800 Sheep 8100

It was a pretty good quality yarding with a good selection of trade lambs along with some outstanding heavy weights. There was also good numbers of ideal store lambs along with good numbers of very light lambs all being sold prematurely due to the drought.

Light weight lambs to the processors were firm to \$3 dearer with the 12kg to 18kg 2 scores selling from \$80 to \$140/head. Trade lambs were firm to \$4 dearer with the new season lambs selling from \$138 to \$180/head. Trade weight old lambs sold from \$138 to \$193/head to average between 750c and 785c/kg cwt. Heavy weight lambs were \$4 to \$6 cheaper with the over 24kg old lambs selling from \$183 to \$228 while heavy new season lambs sold to \$215/head. Trade weight Merino lambs sold from \$128 to \$166/head. Restocker lambs were \$6 to \$8 dearer with the better lambs selling from \$125 to \$165 while lambs to the feeders sold from \$115 to \$166/head. Very young lambs to the restockers sold from \$40 to \$95/head. Hoggets sold to \$170/head.

There were some outstanding sheep yarded along with the expected plainer types in a mixed yarding of mutton where most grades were firm to \$3/head dearer. Merino ewes sold from \$36 to \$185 while crossbred ewes sold from \$52 to \$212 and Dorpers sold to \$164/head. Merino wethers sold to \$164/head. Carcass prices for the prime sheep ranged from 585c to 645c/kg cwt. The restockers were active on some lines of outstanding quality four-and-a-half-year-old Merino ewes off shears which sold from \$150 to \$178/head.

DETAILED SALEYARD REPORT - SHEEP AND LAMB

Cowra report date 17 January 2020

Yarding 3625 **Lambs** 3050 **Sheep** 575

Lamb numbers decreased and the quality was good. Trade and heavy lambs were best supplied and there were limited numbers of store lambs. The market sold to a dearer trend.

The few store lambs sold \$15 dearer, making from \$101 to \$128/head on heavier lambs. Trade weights were \$3 to \$8 dearer, the bigger increase in the heavier lambs, selling from \$140 to \$176/head. Heavy lambs sold from \$178 to \$196/head. Extra heavy weights made from \$193 to \$235/head or from 660c to 725c/kg cwt on average.

Mutton numbers were well back and quality mixed. Mostly ewes were penned in a dearer market. Medium weight ewes sold from \$118 to \$144/head. Heavy crossbred ewes sold from \$178 to \$205 and Merino ewes reached \$180/head.

DETAILED SALEYARD REPORT – STORE CATTLE

CTLX Cattle report date 17 January 2020

Yarding 1825

It was a good quality yarding with a very good selection of well bred steer and heifer weaners along with 260 cows and calves which were mostly good quality Angus units. There were a few pens of PTIC heifers along with four pens of cows. There was a good crowd on hand with solid support coming from southern NSW and Victorian buyers along with some buyers down from the New England. There was also solid support from local districts. With falls of up to 90mm of rain, the market was solid in all sections.

The steer and heifer market were \$100/head dearer and more in places. The steers sold from \$190 for young bobby calves to \$1,080/head for top quality Angus steers. The steer weaners sold up to 438c with the 400c/kg barrier broken on many occasions. The heifers sold from \$240 for plain crossbreds to \$990/head for top Angus heifers. The 400c/kg barrier was broken on one occasion while the bulk of the better heifer calves sold from 250c to 300c/kg with odd sales higher. Four pens of PTIC heifers sold from \$800 for Red Angus heifers to \$1,020/head for Black Angus heifers.

Cows and calves were \$200/unit dearer. The best of the cows and calves were a line of top-quality Angus cows with their 2nd to 4th calf at foot. They sold for \$1,510 while the balance of the cows and calves sold from \$700 for plain crossbreds to \$1,450/unit for 3rd calf Angus units. Two pens of PTIC cows sold for \$980 and \$1,370 while two pens of dry cows sold for \$855 and \$890/head.


