



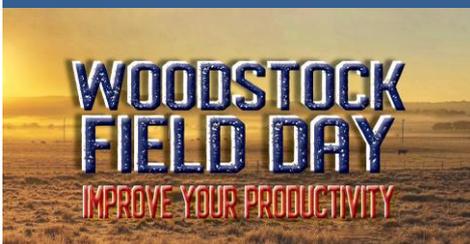

DETAILED SALEYARD REPORT – CATTLE

CTLX Carcoar report date 21 January 2020

Yarding 3470

The stronger markets and the disappointment by the amount of rain received by some boosted numbers by 850. It was a good quality yarding with good numbers of young cattle to suit the feeders and processors. There were a few lots of well finished grown steers and heifers and there were large numbers of cows. There were also good numbers of young calves in most runs. A full field of buyers were in attendance and operating.

Young cattle to the trade were dearer with prime heifer yearlings selling from 270c to 285c/kg. Feeder steers were 13c to 16c dearer, while the feeder heifers were up to 24c/kg dearer. The feeder steers sold from 270c to 329c while the feeder heifers sold from 255c to 289c/kg. Young restocker cattle were a little dearer with the young steers selling from 250c to 331c, while the young heifers sold from 200c to 272c/kg.

Prime grown steers were 7c dearer selling from 265c to 300c/kg. Grown heifers were up to 20c dearer with the better types selling from 245c to 285c/kg. Cows were 30c to 35c dearer with the 2 scores selling from 150c to 224c/kg. The better 3 and 4 score cows sold from 205c to 264c with the prime heavy weights averaging 251c/kg. Bulls sold to 285c/kg.

DETAILED SALEYARD REPORT - SHEEP AND LAMB

CTLX Carcoar report date 22 January 2020

Yarding 11400 Lambs 7100 Sheep 4300

Numbers were down by 700 for a plainer quality yarding. There were odd pens of good trade lambs and heavy weight lambs mixed throughout though a large percentage of the yarding

consisted of lightweight lambs suitable for the restockers. All the usual buyers were in attendance and operating.

Light weight lambs to the processors were \$5 dearer with the 12 to 18kg 2 scores selling from \$85 to \$140/head. Trade lambs were \$4 to \$8 dearer with the new season lambs selling from \$136 to \$192/head to average from 760c to 790c/kg cwt. Trade weight old lambs sold from \$144 to \$187/head. Heavy weight lambs were around firm with the new season lambs over 24kg selling from \$184 to \$225, while the heavy weight old lambs sold to \$215/head. Lambs to the restockers and feeders were \$4 to \$6/head dearer. The better lambs to the restockers sold from \$95 to \$159, while the feeders paid from \$132 to \$174/head. Very young lambs to the restockers sold down to \$30/head. Hoggets sold to \$178/head.

It was a good quality yarding of sheep where most grades were \$11 to \$13/head dearer. Merino ewes sold from \$40 to \$196 while crossbred ewes sold from \$53 to \$229/head. Merino wethers sold from \$55 to \$190/head. Carcase prices for the prime sheep made from 590c to \$635c/kg cwt.

DETAILED SALEYARD REPORT - SHEEP AND LAMB

Cowra report date 24 January 2020

Yarding 5210 **Lambs** 4000 **Sheep** 1210

A larger number of lambs were drawn for and the quality was plainer. There were fewer heavy trade and heavy lambs offered and while there were good numbers of trade lambs there were more store lambs penned. The market sold to a firm to dearer trend.

Light restocking lambs sold from \$60 to \$82 and trade weighted lambs to restockers reached \$159/head. Trade lambs were \$3 to \$5 dearer with the medium and heavy trade lambs to 24kg sold from \$152 to \$198/head averaging 780c to 800c/kg cwt. Heavy lambs were firm to \$3 dearer selling from \$195 to \$208/head. Extra heavy lambs sold from \$204 to \$232/head or 720c to 750c/kg cwt.

Mutton numbers doubled and the quality was mostly plain. Prices slipped \$5/head across most of the sheep. Medium weight ewes sold from \$115 to \$140/head. Heavy crossbred ewes sold from \$163 to \$200/head. Most averaged 580c to 610c/kg cwt.
